The Animal Protective League's Spay/Neuter Clinic addresses companion animal overpopulation in Sangamon County and surrounding communities. This unique high-quality, high-volume, low-cost spay/neuter program performs 30 or more spay/neuter surgeries daily. As a regional facility, we partner with animal control agencies, shelters and rescue groups within a 90-mile radius. Our goal is to defeat the tragedy of companion animal overpopulation by targeting the most prolific populations... ferals, strays, and other unaltered animals whose owners often cannot afford the cost of spaying or neutering their companion animals or don't have any idea why they should.

Surgeries are scheduled by appointment only. No walk-ins will be accepted. To schedule your appointment, please call 217-789-SPAY (7729), or visit the contact section of our website.

Fees:

Female and Male Dogs = \$55.00

Female Cats = \$45.00

Male Cats = \$35.00

Feral Cats = \$25.00

If your dog is a Pit Bull or Pit Bull mix, please ask about our Free Pit Bull Spay/Neuter Program.

APL requires that all dogs and cats have a rabies vaccination. If you do not have proof of current vaccination, your pet will receive a rabies shot at the time of surgery for an additional \$9.00.

Additional Services:

Rabies (1 year) = \$9.00

Rabies (3 year) = \$12.00

(There is an additional \$9.00 registration fee if you reside in Sangamon County)

Canine Distemper = \$9.00

Bordetella (kennel cough) = \$9.00

Feline Distemper = \$9.00

Microchip (Home Again) = \$12.00 (Optional \$14.99 registration fee)

Frontline (for fleas) = \$10.00 (Applied in-house)

The clinic's sole mission is spay/neuter. We do not perform any other types of services. APL recommends that every pet owner establish a relationship with a local veterinarian.

Please inform us if your animal has any prior medical conditions. APL reserves the right to refuse surgery to an animal if a health risk is determined. We will not accept animals exhibiting signs of Upper Respiratory Infection (runny eyes and nose or coughing).

Spay or neuter can be performed on puppies and kittens as small as two pounds or eight weeks old. All animals over four months of age should have food withheld after midnight the night before surgery. Puppies and kittens four months and younger may have food throughout the night before surgery. All animals may have water until 6:00 a.m. the morning of surgery.

Please bring all dogs on a leash and all cats in a cat carrier.
